Second Captain Robert Newland was second in command of 'G' Troop at Waterloo Mercer describes Newland joining vice Packenham later, ie close to Waterloo This cannot be possible The troop, while in England in March 1815, when it was Sir Augustus Fraser's troop, clearly shows Mercer and Newland as captains in the troop at Colchester

1815, included in Waterloo Reminiscences, gives a loss of 90 horses for 'G' Troop This figure is certainly closer to the 69 in the official muster lists, than Mercer's claim of 140 lost All those that Mercer mentions in his book as killed or wounded are indeed recorded as sick or dead on the muster lists, thereby confirming his account

The Waterloo Campaign

The Waterloo Campaign "Three memorable days in June 1815" Captain Cavalie Mercer held the rank of Second Captain in G Troop The Troop was in fact commanded by Sir Alexander Dickson, but as he was temporarily assigned to other duties it was Mercer who was left in command at Waterloo It

was a fine troop, perfect in drill and splendidly

In General Mercer's Journal of the Waterloo Campaign , published in 1870, the following sentence occurs, dated 5 November, 1815, noting his departure from England, on board the packet for Calais : - " As we left, the guns on Dover Castle announced Guy Faux by a royal salute" (Vol II p 306)
